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ABOUT THE MOVIE | I WANT (NO) REALITY

I WANT (NO) REALITY is a sensual & entertaining glimpse at a 5-year relationship of a young director with a group of artists who made a fundamental choice of putting creativity beyond everything else in their lives.

Ana Brzezińska's debut movie features Needcompany, an internationally famous theatre ensemble – one of the most popular avant-garde theatre companies in Europe. Creators of the movie show that there is more to Needcompany's spectacular success than mere artistic prowess. **I WANT (NO) REALITY** is a radical affirmation of the belief that without love, trust and courage in breaking rules of *reality*, every single human activity becomes vain.

The founder and artistic director of Needcompany, Jan Lauwers is a Belgian director and visual artist. For the last 25 years his interdisciplinary ensemble has been known for its passionate human stories, bringing new standards to contemporary art.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Jan creates large, epic theatrical narrative, strikingly elaborate and multi-dimensional. He tries to challenge the era we live in with the place of art in the modern world; confronting the 20th century tradition. Grace lets her imagination roam free and avoids any political themes. She is more interested in exploring the areas of human instinct and the subconscious. That's how I see their work.

When I first met them it was love at first sight. I met them in Avignon and I saw their performance for the first time. It was 2005 or 2006. They were presenting a workshop for one of the parts from their *Trilogy* in a churchyard of Cloître des Célestins. It was brilliant. I was completely amazed. I knew I had to get to know this people. And when they were showing the complete *Trilogy* a year later, I approached Jan in the foyer and talked him into giving me our first talk.

I wanted to make a movie about people who changed my life, and who work in a medium so transient, so hard to record. That was my starting point.

Theatre only exists during the show or a rehearsal. It cannot be recorded or described properly outside the stage. Everyone who has ever worked for the theatre knows it is a unique medium. You invest everything in your work and when the show is over, your own memories and the audience's recollections are all there is ever left. Theatre artists create a rather special environment. I would like to avoid bringing forward an impression of false sublime, but there is a certain dramatic aspect to their everyday existence. Going out on stage is an extremely arduous work and it leaves you without any real proof that you achieved something. Which is something of true importance nowadays. Only people with real passion are able to bear with it. You may feel envious when you look at them, but then again no one would really like to switch places with a theatre actor. Their everyday routine is not exactly what you call a wholesome lifestyle.

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WHY NEEDCOMPANY? | ABOUT NEEDCOMPANY

Needcompany is a theatre ensemble established in Belgium in 1980s, a country embodying the very idea of European integration and yet torn by internal divisions. Together with an Indonesia-born choreographer Grace Ellen Barkey, Belgian visual artist Jan Lauwers decided to create a non-commercial theatre company in order to tell stories one could not tell alone.

Through all these years they managed to pull together a group of outstanding, multidisciplinary artists. Today, Needcompany is considered one of the most popular and innovative theatre companies in Europe.

- Needcompany is so close to my heart because of its complex, severe, but in the end, very positive approach to human life. It's not only the whole "concept of love", manifesting itself in everything they do, but also their methods of work and their attitude towards people and current artistic phenomena – says Ana Brzezińska, director of I WANT (NO) REALITY.

For years, Needcompany's main focus was the need to cooperate. Every artist brings something unique to the teamwork and simultaneously continues to work on his/her individual projects.

Although the ensemble tours more than 200 days a year, it manages to keep in close touch with everyday reality. Needcompany's shows speak about war, violence, fears and anxieties of the modern world, and yet the way they tell their stories is ever so colourful, vibrant and optimistic. They borrow elements from European tradition to create a new language, in which they dare speak out loud: a human being needs another human being more than anything else in the world.

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DIRECTOR | ANA BRZEZIŃSKA

Born in 1983 in Warsaw. Director and video artist. Graduate of the Drama Directing Department at the Polish Academy for Dramatic Arts in Krakow. Her articles on film and theatre have been published in major Polish cultural magazines. Longtime collaborator (editor, producer) at TVN, the biggest Polish private TV station.

Her theatrical debut was a multimedia show "We Are oh so Lucky" (2009), carried out in cooperation with Harakiri Farmers, a performative duo. It was presented at numerous local and European international theatre festivals.

She created numerous video works for various institutions, including: Centre of Contemporary Art Ujazdowski Castle, Needcompany, and top Warsaw-based theatres: TR Warszawa and Nowy Teatr.

In 2009 Jan Lauwers commissioned her to direct a four-part video series presented at "The Tragedy of the Applause", an international exhibition in Roubaix, France.
